Nursery

Nursery children have welcomed six new friends this week and spent time sharing routines and settling in together. It has been a joy to see new friendships being formed and games played. They have shared the story "The Very Busy Spider" by Eric Carle and enjoyed parachute games in the main hall.

Year One

Year One have read "Errol's Garden" together. Within their own writing, they have used adjectives while, in maths, they have looked at number bonds to 20. Our children enjoyed using junk modelling to build animals. Within RE, children heard the story of Palm Sunday while, in PSHE, they learnt about being healthy. In PE, children have started their athletics topic, walking, jogging and running, alongside learning tennis ball skills.

Year Three

Year Three have shared the books "Land of Roar" and "The Jolly Postman". They have been looking at letters, specifically the purpose of sending them and the persuasive features they sometimes include. During maths, Year Three have looked at 2D shapes, identifying and comparing them. As part of geography, they located the French city of Marseille on a world map and on a European map; they have discussed reasons that people might visit a town such as Marseille. In computing, they created branching databases. Children enjoyed being outside to start their cricket topic during PE and they have also begun to learn a special song to share at our VE Day celebration.

Year Five

Year Five have been writing in the past tense, learning how to change the verbs to write using 'past progressive'. Children used the platform 'Scratch' to code and decode various instructions. In music, they thoroughly enjoyed their ukelele session, recapping previous learning from Year Four and starting to build on those skills. As part of science, Year Five have started to look at evolution and inheritance, learning the difference between inherited characteristics and adapted characteristics.

Reception

Reception have shared the books "The Frog Prince" and "Jack and the Beanstalk". They visited the school pond to take part in pond dipping and discovered lots of tadpoles, which led to discussion and writing all about the life cycle of a frog. In early maths, children counted in tens to 120 and looked at bigger numbers. Children have spent time this week talking about how to use their words to explain how they are feeling and they have also made egg cressheads in class! They were excited to join in with Ms Thornber's singing assembly on Wednesday and play on the big yard with Key Stage One.

Year Two

In Year Two, children have shared the books "Someone" by Walter De La Mere, and "Fantastic Mr Fox" by Roald Dahl. In writing, they have created performance poetry, using expression, rhythms and actions when sharing their poems while, in maths, children thought about position and direction, using quarter and half turns in clockwise and anticlockwise directions. Children learnt about the importance of rest and sleep in their PSHE lessons. Within computing, Year Two learnt about digital music and, using Chrome Music Lab, listened to Gustav Holtz's "The Planets"; they were also treated to a flute rendition of this piece by Mr Barker, who played "Venus" – the children were incredibly impressed!

Year Four

Children in Year Four have been sharing the book "The Witches". They have written a newspaper article about Mount Everest while, in maths, they have learnt about statistics. Children learnt about volcanoes in geography while, in design technology, they have thought about building earthquake-proof buildings. During RE, children have learnt more about the Christian faith, focusing on beatitudes while, in PSHE, they have discussed the importance of a healthy body and mind.

Year Six

Year Six are sharing the book "Who Let the Gods out". In their own writing, they are retelling the story of Beowulf. During maths, Year Six have been revising the skills that they have been taught throughout Key Stage Two to ensure they feel confident for their upcoming SATs; they also took part in an online workshop about square roots. During history, they have been learning about Ancient Greece, starting by looking at where this era sits on a timeline. They used micro:bits to sense movement in computing and enjoyed cricket as part of PE.
