Fellside Community Primary School - Home

#### Nursery

Nursery children have been sharing and enjoying the book "On a Pirate Ship" by Sarah Courtauld. They have also been 'writing' about people who help us, using their wonderful early mark making skills. Children have made boats and raced them in the water outside, as well as preparing for Sports Day. They have also enjoyed meeting with their Reception friends to prepare for the "Mini Big Sing" coming up.

#### **Commitment winner: Louis W**

#### Year One

"The Sea Saw" is the book which Year one have shared this week. Together, they have been predicting what might happen in the story, using their senses to describe what is happening and being emotion detectives; they also described the sea and learnt new vocabulary. In maths, children measured suing the terms 'weight' and 'mass'. In history, children learnt about sources of evidence while, in computing, they used digital writing skills to create missing posters.

#### Year Three

Year Three have continued to share "The Story of Pompeii" and "The Land of Roar" together. They have been writing about the escape from Pompeii, describing the eruption. Year Three have also been dividing two digit by one digit numbers using formal method. In French, children have become skilled at asking for an ice cream while, in science, they have been investigating reflective materials, thinking about which are the best reflectors of light.

#### Year Five

This week, the children in Year Five took full ownership of their story endings by planning plot twists, before writing them up. Year Five have been learning how to calculate the differences between positive and negative numbers, applying them to real life problems such as temperature

differences. Year Five explored a variety of designs before finalising their own patterns for their pencil case stitching. During science, learning about living things, children recapped the parts of a lowering plant and the roles they play in the reproduction of other plants; they also learnt about the changes girls can expect as part of growing up and who they can talk to about things in school.

#### Reception

Reception have enjoyed sharing the book "Tiddler". They have been writing their names and some sentences, too. During early maths, they have thought about days of the week, the routines of the day and also introduced "o clock". As part of early history, children completed their own timelines. They have enjoyed singing songs in preparation for the Mini Sing and had a great time at Whickham School for fun games this week!

#### Year Two

The class have enjoyed sharing "Rainbow Fish" by Marcus Pfister, alongside "The Bee Book" by Charlotte Milner and "Flat Stanley and the Magic Lamp". In their own writing, children write instructions about how bees make honey. During maths, Year Two learnt about capacity and volume, measuring in millilitres and litres. Year Two discussed the continent of Asia and found out information that they found interesting. They also enjoyed making chassis and axles using various resources.

#### Year Four

Year Four have been learning about the legend of the Lambton Worm while, in maths, they have cemented more multiplication and division knowledge. As part of geography, they thought about sustainability while, RE focused on Christian symbols. During PSHE, children learnt the links between a healthy body and healthy mind. During music, they thought about the classical music genre.

#### Year Six

Year Six children have been very busy rehearsing for a special show...

Alongside this, they have edited newspaper reports in their writing lessons and solved varied problems in maths. During history, children learnt about the Battle of Marathon. As part of RE, Year Six considered their own views regarding religion while, in PSHE, they thought about the changes happening as we grow up and become young adults.
