Nursery

Nursery children have been sharing the book "Who Are You?" by Smriti Halls. They have been drawing and mark making images to show who lives in their house, as well as their likes and dislikes. They have had lots of discussions around different types o families this week which was lovely! Mrs Green donated her boomwhackers and the children have really enjoyed playing with them outside, making lots of musical noise! Children found a very furry caterpillar outside and also enjoyed chopping and helping to prepare the snack tray this week.

Year One

Year One have shared the book "Pumpkin Soup" as well as "Brambley Hedge" and "We're Going On A Bear Hunt". Within their writing, they have focused on using 'and' to join ideas together while, within maths, the focus has been on subtraction skills. Children have learnt about aerial views on maps during geography, and printing during art. As part of their new computing theme, children have explored Purple Mash and discussed technology outside of school. In science, the focus has been on waterproof materials while PSHE focus was all about being kind.

Year Three

In Year Three, children have shared chapter fourteen of "Matilda" as well as the boko "Stone Underpants". Within their own writing, they have crated non-chronological reports to tell people about woolly mammoths. They have spotted patterns and added across 10 and 100 in maths. The highlight of the week was definitely the visit to Rising Sun. Children learnt how to make flat bread and cook on an open fire. They learnt to make flour from wheat using three steps (threshing, winnowing and grinding). They looked at artefacts to help them to understand what life was like in the Stone Age and made shelters like in the Mesolithis period.

Year Five

Year Five have had a great week continuing their writing theme via the film 'Rock, Paper, Scissors". Within maths, they have moved onto further learning about multiplication and division. Children have extended their learning in history, focusing on the Mayan hierarchy. Within PSHE, children learnt about appropriate touch.

Reception

Children in Reception have been sharing the book "Tree". They have continued to write their names alongside the letters h b f l. In early maths, there has been a focus on 1 less and 1 more, thinking about numbers up to five. They have drawn images of themselves and made themselves Autumnal crowns. During computing lessons, they have learnt how to control a mouse, clicking images on a screen, and they have also discussed the importance of saying please and thank you — particularly important during lunch times.

Year Two

Year Two children have had a lovely week thinking about list poems, alongside expanded noun phrases and apostrophes for possession – wow! Within maths, the focus has been on '1 more', as well as 'making ten then adding on'. They have looked at the features of castles and also discussed where we find IT and what kind of IT is around us. Within gymnastics, pupils leant about sequencing balances, shapes and traveling.

Year Four pupils have been sharing the book "Billionaire Boy" alongside "Hidden Figures". Children have begun to write letters to Katherine Johnson's boss within their English lessons while, in maths, they have been adding and subtracting with exchange and 6 times table. In history, they have thought about the gods that the Ancient Egyptians believed in while, in art, they made masks out of clay.
