Last week, we embraced Safer Internet Week, beginning with a whole-school launch assembly that encouraged everyone to think carefully about how to stay safe and respectful online. Across Years 1–6, pupils then took part in follow-up lessons tailored to their age groups, exploring topics such as digital kindness, recognising safe websites and understanding the importance of asking for help when something online doesn't feel right. The children engaged brilliantly and demonstrated thoughtful awareness throughout.

A huge thank you to the PTA for organising the Valentine's Disco. Pupils and staff who attended thoroughly enjoyed themselves—it was a wonderful opportunity for the children to have fun together, and we are very grateful for all the hard work that goes into making these events happen.

Year One have been reading "Kitty and the Tiger Treasure" and wrote diary entries from a cat's point of view about the Great Fire of London. In maths, they have been learning to identify different coins and amounts, and in art and design, they explored the vibrant style of pop art. During PE, they particularly enjoyed practising their jumping and rolling skills in gymnastics

Year Two

Year Two have been reading "Rosie Revere Engineer". In writing, they have been finished their biography on Mae Jemison and produced some wonderful work. In maths, they have been adding and subtracting tens and ones from two digit numbers and, and in computing they have created posters to celebrate what they have learned about Safer Internet Day. During PE, they particularly our Games session which focussed on different types of passes and tracking the ball to catch accurately.

Year Three

Year Three continue to enjoy reading *The Christmasaurus*. In writing, they have been practising the use of fronted adverbials, powerful verbs, and adverbs to develop well-structured sentences. In maths, they have been deepening their understanding of fractions of amounts and learning to interpret pictograms. During geography, they explored land use in Whickham and Newcastle upon Tyne. In PSHE, pupils learned about the NSPCC's PANTS rules, and in PE they are continuing to rehearse their whole-class dance.

Year Four continue to enjoy reading *The Tin Forest*. In writing, they have been developing their use of subordinate clauses to enhance their sentences. In maths, they have been learning about time and have also begun exploring shapes and angles.
